There is an option on Lunch Shop to pre-order a packed lunch for this day. The packed lunches have changed and now consist of a sandwich, sausage roll, piece of cake, crisps, fruit & a bottle of water. Our packed lunches are very good value for money! Please could we ask that if you would like to order a school packed lunch, these are pre-ordered by Monday 13th February. Your child should bring a bottle of water and also a snack to eat mid-morning. Please do not send sweets or chocolate. Mobile phones are NOT allowed.

Valentine's Day

The school council have requested that we hold a non-uniform day on Valentine's Day, to raise money for two separate charities. The charities that the children have chosen to support are 'The Princess Trust' & 'The British Heart Foundation'. On this day we would like the children to wear something red or pink (or non-uniform) and pay a £1.00 voluntary contribution for their chosen charities. The Carnegie – 4 O'clock Club

The Carnegie Theatre have launched a 4 o'clock club which started this week. This project will run from 4pm to 6pm every Wednesday and Thursday throughout February and March.

Young people between 8 years and 17 years may attend and receive a free hot, healthy meal and hot or cold drink of their choice.

The project has been set up similar to the Warm Hub but with young people having access to free Wi-Fi to do their schoolwork, board games, music and some films will be screened during these hours.

This project is designed to provide a safe, warm and accommodating space for young people to use and enjoy during the long winter months while money can be tight.

They will have qualified safeguarding personnel on site during these hours.

There are no conditions and this project is open to all people within the age bracket of 8-17.

Parents may accompany their child but would not be eligible for the free meal.

There is nothing to pay at all, as funding has generously been provided by Cumbria County Council.
